| Alderton Memorial Endowment/Dr. Steve | Full- or part-time male grad student working on a Masters degree in Mental Health Counseling. |
| Coates Fund/ J. Dorland and Thomas Jackson | Kentucky resident majoring in teacher education with financial need, above-average academic potential and good citizenship; renewable. |
| Cooper Memorial Fund/The Dean Homer E. | Graduate student in the College of Education, 3.6 GPA minimum. |
| Daniel's Duck Endowed Scholarship/Nancy | For graduates of Model Laboratory High School with at least a 3.0 GPA and pursuing Teacher Education Certification at EKU; renewable, but must reapply to Director or Guidance Counselor at Model Lab. |
| DeHoop Scholarship Fund/Wietse | Special education major demonstrating strong scholarship, service to the profession and community, and leadership potential. |
| Francis Scholarship Fund/S. Evelyn | Senior elementary education major with a language arts emphasis; recommendations from language arts faculty are required. |
| Franz-Myers Scholarship | Students working on a Masters degree in Library Science, renewable for up to two years with a 3.0 GPA. |
| Gifford Endowed Scholarship/Clarence | Full-time elementary or secondary education major who is a Kentucky resident that graduated from a Kentucky high school with financial need, renewable. |
| Hansen Memorial Fund/May | Full-time rising junior majoring in elementary education. Financial need is considered, and scholarship is renewable for senior year. |
| Harris Scholarship Fund/Susan B. | For special education majors with a communications disorder emphasis. |
| House Endowed Scholarship/Ernestine Porter | For full-time student teachers who have been assigned a student teaching position with preference to Laurel County, KY residents. See Dr. Skip Daugherty in Beckham 100 for information about this scholarship. |
| Jennings & Stratemeyer Scholarship | Awarded to one male and one female who are members of Kappa Delta Pi, the education honor society. |
| Little Summer Institute Fund/Thomas & Hazel | For summer courses for grad students training for a career in educational administration with an undergrad GPA of at least 2.5 & graduate GPA of at least 3.5. A 400-500 word essay required on "Why I want to be a School Administrator." Recommendations required. |
| Lutes Memorial Endowed Scholarship/Stella Thompson | Undergraduate or graduate Kentucky resident who completed freshman year at EKU majoring in education, with a 3.0 GPA and qualities of good character, leadership, citizenship, promise of high academic achievement and commitment of service to others; renewable. |

| McGuffey Scholarship Endowment for the Teaching of Mathematics/Carroll | Full-time grad students pursuing a Masters degree in math education who were born in Kentucky, with a preference given to residents of Clinton, Wayne, Cumberland, or Russell Counties first. |
| Miller Award Fund/Nancy | Awarded annually to two graduating Elementary Education majors (K-4, 5-8). One recipient should be an on-campus resident and one an off-campus resident who lives at home. Nominees should be graduating seniors “whose conduct throughout their enrollment at EKU has given evidence of outstanding humanistic and Christian characteristics. The recipients are (to be) individuals whose love for and desire to serve mankind and whose vibrancy, industriousness, and positive attitude have won the respect of faculty and fellow students.” While the student is expected to have a good academic record, outstanding academic performance is not a criterion for selection or recipients of this award. |
| Pigman Memorial Endowed Scholarship Fund/Carrie B. J. | Full-time female elementary education major from Eastern Kentucky with preference given to residents of Floyd or Knot Counties first, renewable. |
| Ramsey Endowed Scholarship Fund/Imogene | Elementary or middle school education majors who have completed 60 hours with at least a 2.75 GPA, for students from EKU’s 22-county service region with preference given to first-generation college students with financial need, renewable. |

| Allison Memorial Endowed Scholarship Fund/ Albert B. | Full-time freshman majoring in education who graduated from Harrodsburg High School. |
| Burdine Memorial Scholarship/The Roxie Pearl Bullock | Graduates of Kentucky Appalachian counties or from three Ohio counties (Adams, Brown, Clermont) with a 3.0 high school cumulative GPA majoring in elementary education; renewable for up to two years if a 3.0 GPA is maintained. |
| Chapman Endowed Scholarship/Ann Daniel | First-year grad student with highest score on GRE or Miller analogy who is pursuing a degree in counseling and educational psychology, must be married or with a permanent domestic partner for at least 6 months prior to applying for the award, must be at least 25 years old but applicants over 30 to be considered first, must be a custodial parent to at least 1 child age 18 years or younger, must be registered for at least 6 credits on the Richmond campus. |
| Clark Memorial Endowed Scholarship in Education/ The Marguerite | Full-time education majors with first preference from Montgomery, Bath, and Fleming counties then second preference from Clark County in Kentucky who have a 3.0 high school GPA and qualities of leadership, citizenship, diligence, and social responsibility. Renewable with a 2.75 GPA. |
| Lamb Scholarship Fund/Dr. Charles R. and Jamie D. | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Graduates of Madison County high schools enrolled at ECU who plan to major in Social Studies (History), English, or music and plan to teach; must come from a single parent family, have limited family income, and be in the upper half of their graduating class. 2. Currently full-time ECU students with financial need from Madison County high schools, or high schools in Clarkesville and Seymour, IN who have successfully completed 24 hours of college credit majoring in Social Studies (History), English, or Music to teach at the high school level. 3. ECU graduate students majoring in Library Science with 1-2 years of teaching experience. |
| Reynolds Memorial Scholarship/Bob | For a Model Lab School grad (preferably) or a Madison County student majoring in education with financial need. Must be enrolled full-time. Renewable. |
